Information on the whereabouts of this cool little critter, the Northern Prairie Skink (*Eumeces septentrionalis*), an endangered species found in southwestern Manitoba. This rare reptile, Manitoba's only lizard, grows to a length of only 15 cm. Its known hideouts include native grasslands and meadows where soils are very sandy.



If you find a skink please contact us at the phone numbers or email address below. Please don't capture any live skinks, just let us know exactly where you saw them. Researchers from Brandon University and Manitoba Conservation will use this information to help protect skinks and their habitat.
